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IT Assessment Initiative

As part of Governor Beshear's Smart Government Initiative (SGI), the Commonwealth contracted with Pacific Technologies, Inc. (PTI), to perform an objective assessment of the IT management practices, organization and costs for the executive branch. The study was completed in August 2012.

PTI analyzed data collected from state agency survey responses and interviews, comparing it against its proprietary database of public sector benchmarks as well as benchmarks from other consulting organizations.



PTI conducted best practices research to compare Kentucky's IT organization, governance and funding models with those of other states.



PTI provided a final report outlining their findings and recommendations.

Findings: IT Governance and Funding

Unlike most other states, Kentucky does not have a full time CIO – inhibiting the Commonwealth’s ability to establish long-term IT direction.

The lack of an effective IT advisory body diminishes agency input on strategic IT direction and contributes to a perception of COT as lacking a customer orientation.

The existing approach to funding IT is complex and not tied to service levels.

The Commonwealth has had difficulty delivering major capital IT projects.

Vendor contract management is inconsistent.

Findings: IT Organization and Service Delivery

Federated IT service delivery is inefficient for provision of commodity IT services.

Previous shared services efforts have had limited success.

IT contractors are costly and use exceeds industry benchmarks.


Efficiency of some IT services is below benchmark levels.

Critical infrastructure is highly distributed and a variety of infrastructure standards exist.

Business continuity capabilities are limited.

Kentucky is positioned poorly for emerging trends in IT service delivery.

Recommendations

Establish a new cabinet level office and hire a full time CIO.

Optimize IT infrastructure.

Reduce statewide IT labor.

Increase statewide IT accountability and transparency.

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Key Points

- The CIO reports to the Secretary of the Finance & Administration Cabinet (FAC) and is a member of the Governor's Executive Cabinet.
- Operational control of infrastructure services shall be the responsibility of the Commonwealth Office of Technology (COT).
- Agencies need the FAC Secretary's approval prior to expending funds for information technology infrastructure services or components.
- All personnel, funds, records, files, and equipment associated with the initiative are assigned to COT.
- Agencies will be able to focus more on the applications that automate agency business functions to support direct public services.

The scope of IT Infrastructure Services includes:

- Computing Equipment, Server, Storage, Network, Desktop Support, Telephony, and IT Facilities
- Enterprise-Level Shared Systems
- IT Security
- Disaster Recovery and Business Continuity
- Database Administration
- Software Licensing
- All Related Planning, Administration, Asset Management & Procurement for IT Infrastructure

Applies to all Executive Branch Cabinets and all agencies except as follows:

- Agencies led by any other Statewide Elected Official
- The Nine (9) Postsecondary Education Institutions
- The Department of Education's Services provided to Local School Districts (K-12)
- The Agencies Administering the Retirement Systems
- The Kentucky Higher Education Student Loan Corporation
- The Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority

- FY2013 - FY2016, total net savings are estimated to be \$32.1M to \$55.6M.






